April 13, 2021

David McCune called the meeting to order and the March 2021 minutes were approved on a motion by Allison Seigers, seconded by Jon Blankenship.

Sally Yates gave the financial report as of March 31, 2021. The report was approved on a motion by Dan Schiedel, seconded by Carrie Sanders.

The Statement of Service for March 2021 was presented by Cheri Ezzell and was approved on a motion by Jon Blankenship, seconded by Joan McIntyre.

Maggie Jackson gave a report on behalf of the Garfield County Department of Health Services regarding the current state of the COVID-19 pandemic in Garfield County. There has been a change in reporting and COVID-19 cases will only be reported weekly from this point forward. Garfield County has 160 active cases and that number is still dropping. There has also been a change in how COVID-19 deaths are reported. The review process in the State was backlogged. The number of deaths were adjusted and the figures now show that there have been 126 deaths in Garfield County. This will increase our case fatality rate because deaths from December are just now being counted. There have been 32,000 doses administered by the Health Department and much thanks to the assistance of OKMRC and the City of Enid. There will be an event on Friday for Tyson employees to be vaccinated. The event for the Johnson & Johnson vaccine is postponed due to the pause in administration of the Johnson & Johnson vaccine ordered by the CDC and FDA. The Health Department continue to encourage others to get vaccinated. Great Salt Plains has a mobile unit and Evans is also offering vaccines. There are seven hospitalizations due to COVID-19 in Enid.

Carrie Sanders reported on behalf of the Governance Committee. There is one Board vacancy "at-large" that is open and they will meet to begin the process of filling that position. There will be an annual meeting in May, and officers will be elected in June.

Kim Kelly then reported on behalf of the Early Childhood Committee. CDSA distributed 1,175 newborn kits in 2020. It seems there are a significant number of babies being born at this time and CDSA continues to collaborate with others to promote immunizations. They are doing Zoom sessions and are preparing a grant for the EarlyBird Striving Readers Program. The EarlyBird Program has increased participation of 15% and continue the partnership with the Institute for Public Advocacy. In northwest Oklahoma, there are 263 childcare facilities and over 8300 children that are being served by CDSA's Childcare Resource and Referral Program. This program is also developing a child trauma response curriculum for childcare providers. They continue to conduct pyramid training, social/emotional health training, and incorporate STEAM into those training opportunities. When screening for developmental delays, approximately 16% have identified delays and there is an increase of parents showing interest in enrolling in EarlyBird sessions.

Dan Schiedel reported on behalf of the Education Committee. They will be meeting on March 10, 2021 to review goals. They also look to meet the morning of the HSA meetings to have additional information on the action plan for the goals that have been set. Those goals are to increase high school graduation rates, build secondary education community supports, and build jobs related to secondary education opportunities in Enid. A Skills Resource Fair is being planned with trauma response advocate and Communities of Hope. They would like to create a summit and identify service gaps. The Coach-a-Kid program is no longer being funded but they continue to explore possible funding opportunities. Jon Blankenship added that there is a concern in legislature regarding Oklahoma's Promise Scholarships and paying back the scholarship if college is not complete after six years.

Janet Cordell was not present to report on behalf of the Health Planning Committee. Dan Schiedel gave an update on homeless dental care. Dr. Rogers with Great Plains Dental is offering a clinic on May 14 from 8 a.m. to 2 p.m. NW Ostepathic Foundation will underwrite the event and Salvation Army will be providing lunch. The Health Department will also be there to administer vaccines. Cheri shared that CDSA was awarded a \$7500 grant from the Integris Foundation for emergency medications and health equipment for those waiting to be approved for Rx Oklahoma.

Sean Byrne was not in attendance to report on behalf of the Mental Health Committee.

Cheri Ezzell then reported that the Safe Sleep infant mortality program will be expanding to all of CDSA's service area in Northwest Oklahoma. Safe Sleep kits will be distributed to most hospitals in Northwest Oklahoma and Dan Schiedel expressed interested in possibly funding this project. Dan Schiedel also shared there have been challenges in Medicaid expansion for the Micronesian population. They are working with Terry Mote.

There being no other business, the meeting was adjourned.
